

MEMBERSHIP POLICY OF THE BRITISH CLUB, YANGON

Members of the British Club, Yangon

Club Members are individuals authorised to use the British Club (for recreation or meetings and events), including BCCM members and their families, staff of the British Embassy and their families, staff of the British Council and their families, accredited diplomats (of some Embassies) and their families, and legacy Club members.

Eligibility for Membership

Membership is granted to:

- Staff of the British Embassy and their families and the British Council and their families
- Legacy members (those who were fully paid members before the club's previous closure in 2020)
- Accredited diplomats from specific embassies and international organizations, including the countries of:
 - o Australia
 - o Canada
 - o Japan
 - o European Union delegation in Yangon
 - o Embassies of the Member States of the EU represented in Myanmar
 - o New Zealand
 - o Norway
 - o Singapore
 - o Switzerland
 - o United States of America
 - o The United Nations
- Teachers can apply to join the British Club by becoming members of the British Chamber of Commerce. This should be done as a school (e.g. BSY, Network), or as individual members. Applications to join as individuals need two referees - see the application form for further details.

Membership Application Process

All new and existing BCCM members must apply through BCCM and all membership applications are subject to due diligence. The British Embassy reserves the right to agree/deny membership applications.

Membership is automatic for British Embassy/British Council staff and families, and for Diplomats of the above listed Embassies.

BCCM Membership Requirements

BCCM members may apply for Club membership. Direct applications at the British Embassy or British Club will be referred to BCCM. Applications should be addressed to membership@britishchambermyanmar.com. You will be sent an application form to complete and return with a digital photo.

Membership Due Diligence Process

BCCM conducts a thorough due diligence process before approving membership.

The British Embassy has the right to reject applicants if issues arise during this review.

British Club Access Requirements

Identification for Club Access

Members must present one of the following to access the Club:

- British Embassy or British Council staff card
- British Club Yangon Membership Card (for BCCM Members)
- Diplomatic Identity Card for those nationalities listed above

Restrictions on Access

Access may be denied under the following circumstances:

- Inadequate identification
- Intoxication or disruptive behavior

The final say regarding Membership of the British Club Yangon rests with the British Embassy.
